### **Teen Retreat**

This camp is for 4-H members ages 13 and older. The camp will feature new 4-H curriculum, service projects and evening entertainment. It will be a fast pace, high energy series of concurrent workshops. Registration is open until December 28th is done via 4 -H connect. The cost for 4-H members is \$120.

### **County Camp**

County Camp allows counties to send youth of all ages (9-18) to camp at the 4-H Conference Center at one time. Whereas Prime Time is age specific, County Camp is for all ages. Campers will experience team-building and communication skills development through their participation in programs such as Challenge Course activities, canoeing, rifle, archery, drama, swimming, dance, arts and crafts, and environmental education.

Who May Attend? County Camp participants are defined as a youth who has completed 2nd grade and are 9 years old through age 18. Clover Kids (ages 5-8) or other youth under age 9 will not be allowed to register for County Camp.

**New for 2010!** The Texas 4-H Conference Center will be offering round-trip bus transportation for campers and chaperones. Top notch, charter coaches, manned with professional drivers and 4-H Center staff, will be traveling to designated pick-up and drop-off points closer to you. For a nominal fee, this service will transport your campers to camp and back to you, saving you time and miles, while your youth enjoy the added benefit of camp songs, games, and activities on the bus ride!
