Steer validation for the 2008 ~ 2009 Show Season is scheduled for Monday, June 23, 2008 at the Big Spring Livestock Auction Barn from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. You should have ordered you steer tags in April.

All steers must be validated on that day to be eligible to show at any livestock show in 2008 or 2009.

Recordbooks will be due in the Howard County Extension Office on Wednesday, June 25, 2008.


Congratulations to our Graduating Seniors

Thanks for all of your contributions to the 4-H program and for your leadership. We appreciate all that you did in 4-H over the years.



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
West Region 4-H Junior High Camp

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4-H CONNECT

The Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program has released a new version of 4-H CONNECT. The new version is a transition from an on-line event registration program to an on-line management program. It now includes the capabilities for on-line 4-H enrollment features, a reporting function for 4-H club managers/project leaders to report attendance and participation numbers from club activities, in addition to the event registration.

Effective with the new system, 4-H CONNECT will not be accepting PERSONAL CHECKS, but will be accepting E-CHECKS. E-checks are processed in the proaching soon ~ livestock judging, fashion show, same manner as Credit Cards, using the account num-

ber. Each 4-H family will be required to set up a family profile. All profiles will have to be accepted for membership by the Texas AgriLife Extension Service ~ Howard County Office before the 4-H family will be able to register for an event. More information will be available at a later date. Step-by-step instructions are available through the Extension Office. Please contact the Extension Office if you have questions regarding this matter.

You will need to set up your family profile soon so you can register for district events that are aproundup, etc.

District 6 4-H Open Trap, Skeet and Sporting Clay Shoot

The District 6 4-H Open Trap, Skeet and Sporting Clay Shoot will be held on Saturday, July 5, 2008 at the Permian Basin Shotgun Range in Midland, Texas. Registration is \$30 per shooter, with trap, skeet and sporting clay rounds being an additional charge.

Pre-registration is due in the

Howard County Extension Office by June 27, 2008.

Trap and Skeet rounds will be \$15.00 for 2 rounds (50 birds). Sporting Clays will be \$15.00 per round for 50 birds.

Age divisions have been adopted by 4-H and will be observed at the District 6 Shoot. Your age is determined as of August 31 of the preceding year. Age divisions are as follows:

* Junior \sim 9 (or 8 and in 3rd grade) - 10

- * Intermediate ~ 11—13
- * Senior 1 ~ 14 15
- * Senior 2 ~ 16 18



J.T. Rutherford Awards

This award is for senior aged 4-H members and consists of a copy of your 4-H Recordbook and a

completed "Application/Nomination for 4-H Recognition." The application form is available on the Texas 4-H website.

Gold Star, Silver Star and Bronze Star award applications are available in the county Extension Office. The Gold Star award is open to any senior aged 4-H member at least 15 years of age who completes a 4-H recordbook and has been an active member for three years. The Silver Star award is for 4-H'ers who are between the ages of 11-14 and who complete a 4-H recordbook. The Bronze Star award is for 4-H'ers who are between the ages of 9 (or in third grade) and 10 years of age and complete a 4-H recordbook. Application forms are available in the Extension Office.

All award applications are due in the Extension Office on Wednesday, June 25, 2008. Please contact the office for a copy of the application forms or if you need additional information.
